

IGNOU Induction Programme at Salesian College Siliguri

With over 1200 students, the Salesian College IGNOU Study Centre is emerging as one of the largest IGNOU Study Centres in Siliguri and North Bengal. For the July 2012 session 625 new students have taken admission in various courses at Salesian College Study Centre. An Induction Programme for all the new students was held at Salesian College Auditorium on Saturday 13 October 2012. The Programme began at 11.00 with Dr. Yonah Bhutia, The IGNOU Regional Director, Siliguri, as the Chief Guest.

Fr. Mathew George, the Coordinator of the Study Centre welcomed all the guests, teachers and participants and spoke about the facilities available in the campus that are being placed at the disposal of the students. Dr. Yonah Bhutia, the Regional Director of IGNOU Centre in Siliguri, congratulated Salesian College for the excellent facilities placed at the disposal of IGNOU students and the efficient and prompt services rendered to them. He acknowledged Salesian College Study Centre as the best study centre in Siliguri and remarked that the students are lucky to belong to such an academic institution of excellence. He explained at length to the students the academic programmes and requirements of IGNOU and took questions from
