Indian Foreign Policy in the 21st Century: Challenges and Prospects

The departments of Political Science of the Salesian College, Sonada (SCS) had organized a one day student seminar on the theme – Indian Foreign Policy in the 21st Century: Challenges and Prospects. The inaugural session of seminar began with the lighting of the lamp by the dignitaries and a prayer by Vice Principal Fr. George Chempakathinal.
