Salesian College, Siliguri Nov 26: The College's three day Annual Cultural and Literary Festival, Innovision today closed with tears of joy and pain in participants' eyes. It all began on Thursday, this time collaborating with the Taverna Trophy, an Inter College basketball Championship, which was organized for the first time by College.
